

ASAP ***Adolescent Violence*** ***Intervention*** ***Program***

An intervention program for young people that provides life skills training for the prevention of violent behavior

Summary

The Adolescent Violence Intervention Program serves boys ages 12 to 18 who have histories of dating violence, violence towards peers, and/or violence towards parent(s).

The program is eighteen weeks and is open ended. A full evaluation assessment is done for each adolescent to determine appropriateness for the program.

Referral Process

Typically, referrals to the program are made by schools, juvenile court probation staff, parents, health and human service agencies, the Department of Youth Services and the Department of Human Services. To make a referral call (617) 884-6829 and speak with Karla or Myrna. There are no program fees for this service. Funding is provided by the Department of Public Health's Bureau of Family and Health.

Services Provided

The program utilizes a curriculum developed by Emerge and Carol Souza and incorporates other materials developed by the Minnesota Domestic Violence Intervention Project.
